Luke 2: 22 - 40 - This is the story of Simeon, a righteous man in Jerusalem. He had been visited by the Holy Spirit who had told him he would not see death until he had seen the Messiah. When he saw Mary and Joseph and the boy Jesus in the Temple he praised God; “for mine eyes have seen your Salvation...” (v30)
